WIMMERA AGRICULTURAL SOCIETIES ASSOCIATION COMPETITION

REGULATIONS:

- 1. A person having won at a local Show will compete at a Wimmera Group final in November
- 2. A person having won at Show level, is not eligible for entry at any other show
- 3. Each article entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor
- 4. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group Final, then 2nd place-getter is eligible to compete
- 5. W.A.S.A. entrants must reside in the boundaries of the Wimmera Group
- 6. Winners at W.A.S.A. Group Final receive \$20 cash
- 7. Items in sections 8 13 must be the same as won at your local Show.
- 8. items 1 7, not cooked or non perishable items, must be the same as won at local show.
- 9. No dressmaker pins to be inserted into cakes, puddings etc.

W.A.S.A. SECTIONS

- 1.4 Sweet Muffins, not iced or decorated, no packet mixes: own recipe, any papers to be
- 2.removed
- 3.Steamed Plum Pudding; own recipe, no smaller than 1 Litre in volume.
- 4.Boiled Plum Pudding, in cloth, cloth removed, own recipe, no smaller than 1 Litre in volume
- 5.4 ANZAC biscuits
- 6. Orange cake, iced, own recipe in a loaf tin
- 7. Loaf of Multi Grain Bread made in bread maker
- 8. Floral Art -my choice to comprise artificial and/or dried material accessories allowed.
- 9. One bottle tomato sauce, one jar relish, one jar mustard pickles
- 10. One jar jam and one jar jelly.
- 11.Decorated Plaque, no larger than 30cm at widest point.
- 12. Crochet A 3D item, no larger than 50cms on any one side, made from pure wool/ wool blend of any ply.
- 13. Knitting Hand knitted garment pure wool/wool blend, label must be attached (W.A.S.A.) Group level prize \$TRA
- 14. Crochet article, made in crochet cotton.
- 15. Crochet/hand knitted article, any ply yarn (note feathers, Jazz etc are not plied yarns (W.A.S.A.) Group level prize \$TBA
- 16. Unspecified article of craft by a Primary School Student
- 17. <u>Junior Handcrafts and Hobbies.</u> The most outstanding Exhibit entry from **Secondary School Students** will be entered in the WASA Competition for Unspecified Article of Craft by a Secondary School Student. (W.A.S.A.) Group level prize \$TBA

VAS REGULATIONS

- 1. A person can represent only one Society or Group for V.A.S.
- 2. An article having won at Show level will compete at Group Final, winner will then compete at next Royal Melbourne Show
- 3. An article having won Group Final cannot compete further until after the Royal Melbourne Show
- 4. An article, having won at the Royal Melbourne Show in any class is no longer eligible to compete in the competition
- 5. Each article entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor
- 6. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level, then 2nd place-getter is eligible to compete
- 7. Items, except Cookery exhibits, must be the same as won at local Show or Group
- 8. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one Show within the State in any one Show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/refund prize-money.
- 9. An article, having won first at a Show, cannot be shown at any other State Show that year. All work to have been completed within the last 12 months

VAS Sections:

1. Rich Fruit Cake: Proudly Sponsored by Ward McKenzie Pty. Ltd.

Needed- 250g sultanas, 250g chopped raisins, 250g currants, 125g chopped mixed peel, 90g chopped red glace cherries, 90g chopped blanched almonds, 1/3 cup sherry or brandy, 250g plain flour, 60g S.R. Flour, 250g butter, 250g soft brown sugar, ¼ tsp grated nutmeg, ½ tsp ground ginger, ½ tsp ground cloves, ½ tsp lemon essence or finally grated lemon rind, ½ tsp almond essence, ½ tsp vanilla essence, 4 large eggs. What to do- Mix together all the fruits and nuts and sprinkle with sherry or brandy. Cover and leave at least 1 hour, but preferably overnight. Sift together the flours and spices. Cream together butter and sugar with essences. Add the eggs one at a time, beating well after each addition, then alternatively add the fruit and flour

mixtures. Mix thoroughly; the mixture should be stiff enough to support a wooden spoon. Place mixture into a prepared 20cm square, straight sided, square cornered tin and bake in a slow oven for approx 3 ½ - 4 hours. Allow cake to cool in tin. Note; to ensure uniformity and depending on size, it is suggested the raisins be snipped into 2 or 3 pieces, cherries 4-6 pieces and almonds crosswise into 3-4 pieces. Final prizes: First \$200 plus Trophy, second \$100, third \$50

2. Junior Boiled Fruit Cake, under 18yrs, recipe from VAS LTD

Needed-375g mixed fruit, ¾ cup brown sugar, 1tsp mixed spice, ½ cup sherry, ½ cup water, 125g butter, ½ tsp bicarbonate of soda, 2 eggs lightly beaten, 2 tbsp marmalade, 1 cup S.R. Flour, 1 cup plain flour, ¼ tsp salt.

What to do- 1. Place the mixed fruit, sugar, spice, water and butter in a large saucepan and bring to the boil. 2. Simmer gently for 3 minutes, then remove, add bicarb soda and allow to cool. 3. Add the sherry, eggs and marmalade, mixing well. 4. Fold in the shifted dry ingredients then place in a greased and lined 20cm round cake tin.

5. Bake in a moderate slow oven for 1.5 hours, or until cooked when tested.

A person will not be permitted to win at more than one show within the State in any one show year. Persons not adhering to

this rule will be required to forfeit/ refund prize money. All work to have been completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to its entry at a local show/ field day. An exhibit may only win one Group Final in a show season (Spring to Autumn), should the same article be entered again and found to have already won a Group Final in the same show season, the exhibitor must forfeit/ refund any and all prizes and will be disqualified from entering for 12months. 4.VAS Ltd Knitting Competition sponsored by Spotlight. Hand knitted jumper or Cardigan made from pure wool/wool blend of any ply and must have attached label from wool used or label and receipt from Woollen Mill. Each exhibit entered must be bona fide work of the exhibitor. An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a 2024 Group Final.

The winning exhibit will then compete in the State Final at the 2024 Royal Melbourne Show. An exhibitor may represent only one local show at Group Level and one Group at State level. An exhibit having won at State Final, is no longer eligible to compete in the competition. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level, the second placegetter is eligible to compete. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one show within the State in any one show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/ refund prize money. No larger than 50cm on any one side. Fabric handle/s. Minimum embellishments allowed. **Must** be lined Sewn by machine, May be hand finished. Knitted/ Crocheted items not acceptable. Each exhibit entered must be bona fide work of the exhibitor. An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a 2024 Group Final. The winning exhibit will then compete in the State Final at the 2024 Royal Melbourne Show. An exhibitor may represent only one local show at Group Level and one Group at State level. An exhibit having won at State Final, is no longer eligible to compete in the competition. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level, the second placegetter is eligible to compete. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one show within the State in any one show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/ refund prize money.

All work to have been completed in the last twelve (12) months prior to its entry at a local show/ field day. An exhibit may only win one Group Final in a show season (Spring to Autumn), should the same article be entered again and found to have already won a Group Final in the same show season, the exhibitor must forfeit/ refund any and all prizes and will be disqualified from entering for 12 months. 6 "VAS Ltd. Patchwork Competition". Sponsored by Spotlight Patchwork piece, no more than 1 metre on any one side, machine pieced and machine quilted. Only finished articles will be accepted. Minimal Embellishments. Small amount only not to overpower patchwork.

Each exhibit entered must be bona fide work of the exhibitor. An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a 2023 Group Final. The winning exhibit will then compete in the State Final at the 2024 Royal Melbourne Show. An exhibitor may represent only one local show at Group Level and one Group at State level. An exhibit having won at State Final, is no longer eligible to compete in the competition. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level, the second placegetter is eligible to compete. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one show within the State in any one show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/ refund prize money. Each exhibit entered must be bona fide work of the exhibitor. An exhibit having won at a Show will compete at a 2023 Group Final. The winning exhibit will then compete in the State Final at the 2024 Royal Melbourne Show. An exhibitor may represent only one local show at Group Level and one Group at State level. An exhibit having won at State Final, is no longer eligible to compete in the competition. If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level, the second placegetter is eligible to compete. A person will not be permitted to win at more than one show within the State in any one show year. Persons not adhering to this rule will be required to forfeit/ refund prize money. Open to Carrot Cake Enthusiasts

Competitors to provide their own recipe. The criteria to entering this competition is that the recipe MUST include no less than 350 grams of carrots. The cake is to be baked in a 20cm round tin and to be uniced. Entries must be submitted with the recipe attached.

VAS Carrot and Date Muffins

A competition for junior cake bakers under 18 on the day of their local show <u>Carrot and Date Muffins</u>:

Ingredients: 2 ½ cups self-raising flour. 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon. ¼ teaspoon ground nutmeg. 1 cup brown sugar(firmly packed). 1/3 cup chopped pitted dates. 1 cup coarsely grated carrot. 1 tablespoon orange marmalade. 1 cup canola oil. 2 eggs, lightly beaten. ¾ cup orange juice. 1 cup reduced fat milk. Method: 1. Pre heat oven to 190°C (moderately hot).

- 2. Line a 12 hole muffin pan with Round Paper Muffin Cases Classic White Muffin Cases Size (35mm height x 90mm wide x 50mm base)
- 3. Sift dry ingredients into a large bowl; stir in dates, carrots. Then add the combined marmalade, oil, eggs, juice and milk. Mix until just combined.
- 4. Spoon mixture evenly into Muffin paper cases in muffin pan.
- 5. Cook for 20 minutes. To test if muffins are cooked, insert cake skewer; if it comes out clean, the muffins are ready.
- 6. Stand muffins in pan for 5 minutes before removing to cool.

Show entries: Four (4) muffins per plate

Rules and Regulations

- 1. The carrot cake competitions follow the show-group-state level of competition
- 2.An exhibitor having won at a Show, will bake another cake for entry in the Group Final; the winner will then be required to bake a further cake for the State Final
- 3. Exhibitors are to follow the recipe and specifications (listed over)
- 4.An exhibitor having won at show/field day level is not eligible to enter any other show/field day until after the Group judging, when, if not the winning entry, can compete further
- 5.An exhibitor is only eligible to represent one Group in the State Final
- 6.Each cake entered must be the bona fide work of the exhibitor
- 7.If for any reason a winner is unable to compete at Group or State Final level then the second placegetter is eligible to compete

State Final prizes: first - \$250 plus Trophy, second \$100, third \$50

Hot tip for exhibitors.

A well-kept competition cake making secret: lay a tea towel over the cake rack before turning the cake out to prevent the imprint of the cake rack appearing on your competition cake.

RULES AND REGULATIONS

all exhibits must be the bonfire property of the exhibitor, or recognised firm, and a statutory declaration of same respecting age and eligibility must be made if required.

entries must be lodged with the secretary at the office, Dimboola, by Friday prior to the show, when a ticket will be given stating the class section and number of the exhibit for which the entry is made. <u>Entries maybe made up to 6pm on FRIDAY prior to the show.</u>

- (a) The committee reserves the right of refusing or cancelling any entry without giving a reason for doing so.
- (b) All persons exhibiting shall accept the decision of the judge or judges appointed by the Society and in any case of written protest, the decision of the committee shall be accepted as final and without recourse, except by appeal to the VAS LTD
- (c) The committee may withhold any prize where an exhibitor, is making any entry, has made statements proved to their satisfaction to be erroneous of fraudulent, such exhibitor and his stock shall be disqualified and debarred from exhibiting at the Societies Show during the pleasure of the committee. A disqualified exhibitor, if also a member shall be liable to expulsion from the Society.
- (d) Entries to the Show are accepted subject to the rules and regulations and by-laws.
- (e) The entrant agrees to be bound by those Rules and Regulations and By-Laws.
- (f) The entrant also agrees to abide by all decisions made by the Society or the Group with which it is affiliated or by VAS LTD pursuant to those Rules and Regulations and By-Laws.
- (g) No decision so made shall be called into question by the entrant before any court or other body (whether or not of a similar nature to a court) whatsoever.
- 3.Members of the society or recognised firm paying \$20.00 may exhibit in any class without charge unless expressly stated in the schedule. Non-members will be charged an entry fee unless especially mentioned on the program. No entry will be received unless the entry fee is paid at the time of entry.
- 4.In the different classes with the exception of sections mentioned, no exhibit shall be allowed to compete in more than one section.
- 5.No exhibitor shall be allowed in that portion of the yard in which his exhibit is placed during the adjudication (unless allowed by the stewards) and it shall be the duty of the stewards to prevent any person interfering with the judges and excepting those in charge of stock and for whom an authority must be obtained, will be permitted to remain in the yard during adjudication, under pretence whatsoever, the person in charge must not leave their respective lots or address the judge unless authorised by the stewards of the exhibition.
- 6.As many persons will be allowed into the yards free as the Committee may deem necessary to take charge of the exhibits. After the entries are made and passes will be issued to all such on application to the Secretary, but no pass will be issued unless the entrance fee is 50c or over.
- 7.The owners or exhibitor of any exhibit disapproved of as an exhibit by the Committee of the Society must be immediately upon notice to the effect remove such exhibit from the Society's ground.
- 8. The Judge or Judges may award a second or third prize instead of the first one or may withhold a prize altogether where there is no competition or where the exhibits are of not sufficient merit.
- 9.No prize can be awarded by the Judge or Judges for extra exhibits if the prize list contains a class or section in which the same can compete.
- 10Should any exhibit having gained a prize be disqualified, the next on the list does not necessarily obtain the same prize. The Committee with or without the advice of the Judge or Judges, decides the question.
- 11.No exhibit, without the permission from the Secretary can be removed from the exhibition until 5pm on the day of the Show (with the exception of horses), when all exhibits can leave the yard.
- 12 Protests against awards, accompanied with the deposit of \$100.00, which will be forfeited if the protest in considered frivolous, must be lodged with the Secretary in writing before 10am on the day after such awards were made excepting all Horse sections. Refer to notice to competitors.
- 13 The privilege of distributing trade lists, advertisements and other documents is restricted exclusively to exhibits at their respective stands. Any infringement of this regulation will occur expulsion from the yards.
- 14. Exhibitors enter at their own risk and the Society takes no responsibility for loss or damage occurring
- 15.All exhibitors of stock will be required to provide their own forage and exhibitors of machinery, all fuel and material necessary to enable them to comply with the above regulations.
- 16. The age of exhibit stock must be set forth in entry. Any violation of this rule may disqualify the exhibit.
- 17. The breeding years date from August 1 for Horses.
- 18. No implements or machinery can be removed from their section during the exhibition.
- 19.All exhibits must be in their places on the ground at their appointed times,
- 20.All live stock, including poultry, must be in their places in the yard by 9:30am and home produce, grain and miscellaneous in their places by 10:00am on the Show Day.

- 21.Exhibitions of 2023 will be open to all members on Saturday October 21st at 9am and to the public after 10am (expect for the Pavilion which will be opened at the conclusion of judging)
- 22.Admission: Adults \$10:00, Children under 16yrs \$2:00, Pre-School Children free.
- 23.Members fees \$20:00. Members will be entitled to one Member's and one Guest ticket. On production of the ticket, admission to the Societies exhibition of 2023 will be granted.
- 24. The Committee reserves the right to postpone or alter the date of the Show if it is necessary, and the Committee incurs no responsibility or liability by reason of such postponement.
- 25. The Society is prepared to give liberal encouragement to all kinds of novelties calculated to improve new and existing industries, and may award prizes to such extra exhibits if deemed worthy.
- 26.Intending competitors are particularly requested to observe the date fixed for the reception of entries at the office, as the rules will be strictly adhered to, and also that the entry ticket must be produced attached to each lot at the place of exhibition, and not removed until authorised by the Secretary. (Except classes which do not require entry tickets)
